POPULATION

- In 2010, there were 103,710 children between the ages of 0 and 17 living in Boston. This represented 16.8% of the total city population.
- Boston's child population has dropped 11% since 2000. During that year, children represented 19.8% of the city's total population.

- Nearly 40% of Boston's children live in Dorchester or Roxbury.
- Dorchester has a significantly greater portion of the citywide population under 18 compared to its proportion of the citywide overall population.

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

- While only 8.1% of Boston's children are foreign born, nearly half (49.3%) live in households with at least one foreign born parent.
- Over half (54.6%) of Boston's children live in households headed by a single parent.
- Between 2000 and 2010, all racial and ethnic groups, with the exception of Hispanic, saw significant decreases in their under 18 population.
- African American and Hispanic children comprise 60% of Boston's under 18 population

POVERTY

• 30.5% of Boston's children live in households with incomes below the poverty line. Comparatively, 21.2% of households in boston are in poverty.

EDUCATION

- Close to 80% of Boston's children enrolled in school (ages 3-17) are educated through the public school system.
- Half of Boston's white children are enrolled in private school. 86% of Boston's minority children are enrolled in public school.
