Hyde Park

Hyde Park was an early industrial area, settled in the 1660s to take advantage of the water power provided by the Neponset River and Mother Brook, the first canal dug in the Colonies. Consequently, the area became a manufacturing center, first for paper (Tileston & Hollingsworth), textiles (the Dedham Manufacturing Company, owned and operated by James Read), shoes (the B.F. Sturtevant Company), and, in later years, electronics (Westinghouse).

The Fairmount area was the first to be developed as a residential community in 1855, and the entire neighborhood was named at that time by Rev. Henry Lyman after "the beautiful and aristocratic suburb of London." Prior to the Civil War, Camp Meigs was established in the Readville section and served as a training camp for troops (including the 54th Regiment commanded by Robert Gould Shaw) and a military hospital.

Hyde Park was incorporated as a separate town, made up of property from Dorchester, Dedham, and Milton in 1868. The lure of municipal services, however, caused Hyde Park to become part of Boston in 1912, the last surrounding town to be annexed.

Hyde Park has always been involved in the politics of the day. In 1870, women in Hyde Park were reportedly the first in the country to vote, casting ballots for candidates for School Committee. Today, Boston's 47th mayor, Thomas M. Menino, is a resident of Readville.

Cleary Square is the main commercial center in Hyde Park, with Wolcott Square serving that function for the Readville section. Open space is provided by the George Wright Golf Course, the Stony Brook Reservation, and various neighborhood parks and playgrounds.


i. NOTES TO THE READER

- 1.Two of the important US Census 2000 data files used in the compilation of demographic reports are Summary File 1 (SF1) and Summary File 3 (SF3). SF1 uses the Short Form questionnaire while SF3 uses the Long Form Questionnaire. Moreover, SF1 is a 100% count giving data to the smallest level of census geography, the Block. SF3 is a sample count of 16% of the population giving data to the Block Group level which is a cluster of Blocks. In the aggregation of SF3 data for this report, the Planning Districts straddle Block Groups boundaries. These will have slightly different numbers from those aggregated using the SF1 data. Total population of the planning district, for example, the South End based on SF1 may show slightly different numbers if compiled using SF3. (See Appendix for a brief description of census geography. Short Form and Long Form Questionnaires can be found on the US Census Bureau website, American FactFinder: http://factfinder.census.gov)
- 2. Because of changes in the boundaries of Block Groups between 1990 and 2000, precise comparison of 1990 and 2000 data on Planning Districts/Neighborhoods is not possible.
- 3. Racial categories of population are limited to six. Hispanic population may be included in any racial group. White alone population includes Hispanic whites. The category of persons belonging to One or More Races is termed Multiracial.
- 4. Numbers within parentheses at the end of the table title represent table numbers assigned by the US Census. These table numbers are useful in accessing data using American FactFinder for different types of geography such as a Census Tract or a city. A list of P (Population) and H (Housing) Tables, which provide data at the Block Group level, is given in the Appendix. This report aggregates only Block Group level data as done for all the Planning Districts. However, data available only for Census Tracts can be aggregated to Boston city to generate a more extensive set of characteristics. Complete census tract data can be found on the US Census website.
- 5. While variables are retained in their original form, some of their class intervals have been aggregated into fewer intervals to make the tables simpler.
- 6. Some tables include additional derived data such as medians or per capita incomes.
- 7. For definition of terms, please see "Census 2000 Glossary", which is published as a separate document (Report # 568) by the BRA .
- 8. Income-related data such as household income, poverty rates, etc. refer to year 1999.




a. Census Geography and Constituent Sub Units








b. Hierarchy of Constituent Units of Census Geography
